

I've wrecked my car and my insurance company wants to total and take it from me. If I do that, I'll have to spend another 5000 to 6000 to get something comparable. I also need to get a school car for my son. My budget was 2000 for that until the collision occurred. They tell me I can buy my car back as is for 6000 and it needs about 6000 in repairs and I'm thinking about doing that and using it for my sons first car. What should I do?

There is a lot to think about there. First, we hope everyone is ok and that there were no injuries in the accident. When a car is involved in an accident and totaled by an insurance company it is very common to have an additional price to pay to get a comparable vehicle. 



CITY FINANCES

2023 Budget









OVERVIEW OF MUNICIPAL ACCOUNTING

Cities use an accounting system called fund accounting. Funds are accounting devices that the City uses to keep track of specific sources of funding(revenue) and spending(expenses) for particular purposes. The City of Brandon maintains fifteen funds. Some of these funds include the General Fund, Water Fund, Sewer Fund, Street Maintenance Fund and the Street Light Fund. Below is an overview of some of the funds the city maintains. Visit https://cityofbrandon.org/finance for a detailed budget, audit and more.

GENERAL FUND

Revenue for the general fund comes mostly from property and sales tax revenue. Departments included in this fund are general government, public safety, public works, health and welfare, culture and recreation and more.

STREET MAINTENANCE FUND

Revenue for the street maintenance fund comes from an annual street maintenance fee on your property taxes. The 2023 assessment is \$2.50 per front footage of your lot. The revenue is used to maintain or repair public streets, like our annual Slurry Seal. A Slurry Seal is done each year in an area of town to extend the life of the road. Replacing curb and gutters, street patching and striping roads are other repairs done on streets to extend the life.

WATER FUND

Revenue for the water fund comes from water usage on your monthly utility bill and this revenue remains in the water fund. The water revenue helps pay for operations, maintenance, capital projects and debt. 2022 major capital projects included Water Tower, Water Treatment Plant, Water Meter Replacement Phase III and new water lines for Core Phase 2A.

SEWER FUND

Revenue for the sewer fund comes from sewer usage on your monthly utility bill and this revenue remains in the sewer fund. The sewer revenue helps pay for operations, maintenance, capital projects and debt. The City has an agreement with the City of Sioux Falls to ship our waste to the Sioux Falls Wastewater Treatment Plant. This is the largest operational cost the City of Brandon has for the sewer fund, coming in at over \$1.2 million dollars in 2022. Studies to compare options and cost have been done in the past, with this being the best option for the City. Those studies can be viewed at https://cityofbrandon.org/publicworks. 2022 projects included new sewer lines in the Core Phase 2A area, Westside Sewer Extension, and Preliminary Design on Dual Force Main.

STREET LIGHT FUND

Revenue for the street light fund comes from street light fee on your monthly utility bill and this revenue remains in the street light fund. The street light revenue helps pay for crossing lights, street lights, all of the streets lights in residential areas and major roads throughout the City of Brandon. A 2022 project included adding lights in the Core Phase 2A project to improve the lighting and safety of the area.
